## June 25

- 1. Self introduction from each university student including the social problems in the world and in Australia.
- 2. Australian food and recipes
- 3. Discuss recipes of Akita food
- 4. Assignments:

Record your menu, breakfast, lunch, and dinner a day. Draw or take a picture of menu Research where ingredients come from

On the first day, students discussed the social problems in the world and in Australia with university students.

## July 2

1. Presentation

High school students will practice for their presentation (10mins) They individually present their menu poster in class using target phrases.

2. Finding distributions of the ingredients

Using the name stickers with a country or an area of Japan, students will stick them on the world map or a map of Japan.

3. Discuss findings from the maps

In June, 2015, 17 students from Victoria University, Australia joined the classes in our school for 2 weeks. Our school students hesitated to talk to them at the beginning, but they gradually communicated each other. Our students spoke only in English. It was sometimes difficult to communicate, but it was the great experiences both Japanese and Australian students.
